Psalms 23:4 Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. **5** You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. Your Scripture for the Day

Monday: Matthew 26:37 He took Peter and the two sons of Zebedee along with him, and he began to be sorrowful and troubled. **38** Then he said to them, "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death. Stay here and keep watch with me." **39** Going a little farther, he fell with his face to the ground and prayed, "My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will." **40** Then he returned to his disciples and found them sleeping. "Couldn't you men keep watch with me for one hour?" he asked Peter. **41** "Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak." **42** He went away a second time and prayed, "My Father, if it is not possible for this cup to be taken away unless I drink it, may your will be done." **43** When he came back, he again found them sleeping, because their eyes were heavy. **44** So he left them and went away once more and prayed the third time, saying the same thing. - (NIV)

Tuesday: Matthew 20:20 Then the mother of Zebedee's sons came to Jesus with her sons and, kneeling down, asked a favor of him. **21** "What is it you want?" he asked. She said, "Grant that one of these two sons of mine may sit at your right and the other at your left in your kingdom." **22** "You don't know what you are asking," Jesus said to them. "Can you drink the cup I am going to drink?" "We can," they answered. **23** Jesus said to them, "You will indeed drink from my cup, but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared by my Father." - (NIV)

Wednesday: John 18:10 Then Simon Peter, who had a sword, drew it and struck the high priest's servant, cutting off his right ear. (The servant's name was Malchus.) **11** Jesus commanded Peter, "Put your sword away! Shall I not drink the cup the Father has given me?" - (NIV)

Thursday: 1 Corinthians 11:23 For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, **24** and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." **25** In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." **26** For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. - (NIV)

Friday: 2 Corinthians 8:1 And now, brothers and sisters, we want you to know about the grace that God has given the Macedonian churches. **2** In the midst of a very severe trial, their overflowing joy and their extreme poverty welled up in rich generosity. **3** For I testify that they gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability. Entirely on their own, **4** they urgently pleaded with us for the privilege of sharing in this service to the Lord's people. **5** And they exceeded our expectations: They gave themselves first of all to the Lord, and then by the will of God also to us. **6** So we urged Titus, just as he had earlier made a beginning, to bring also to completion this act of grace on your part. **7** But since you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in the love we have kindled in you—see that you also excel in this grace of giving. **8** I am not commanding you, but I want to test the sincerity of your love by comparing it with the earnestness of others. - (NIV)

Saturday: Psalms 116:3 The cords of death entangled me, the anguish of the grave came over me; I was overcome by distress and sorrow. **4** Then I called on the name of the Lord: "Lord, save me!" **5** The Lord is gracious and righteous; our God is full of compassion. **6** The Lord protects the unwary; when I was brought low, he saved me. **7** Return to your rest, my soul, for the Lord has been good to you. **8** For you, Lord, have delivered me from death, my eyes from tears, my feet from stumbling, **9** that I may walk before the Lord in the land of the living. **10** I trusted in the Lord when I said, "I am greatly afflicted"; **11** in my alarm I said, "Everyone is a liar." **12** What shall I return to the Lord for all his goodness to me? **13** I will lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of the Lord. **14** I will fulfill my vows to the Lord in the presence of all his people. - (NIV)
